SCHWITTAY FAMILY SETS UP HEIFER MEMORIAL IN MOTHER'S MEMORY. REGISTERED AYRSHIRE CALF TO BE AWARDED ANNUALLY TO YOUTH

The Schwittay family of Peshtigo has started a special tradition in honor of an important woman in their lives. They created the Annual Ardis Schwittay Ayrshire Heifer Memorial in memory of their mom who passed away Jan. 18, 2019, at the age of 73.

By providing the opportunity for a youth to bring home a registered Ayrshire heifer calf, the Schwittays hope to keep the memory of their mother alive while supporting the dreams of a young person in the dairy industry.

"Mom was extremely passionate about her calves and teaching others responsibility, compassion and independence," said Monica Schwittay, Ardis' daughter-in-law, who is married to her son, Jeremy. "Donating a calf seemed like the perfect idea since calves were her thing."

Ardis Schwittay was the matriarch of Schwittay Farms LLC, which is run by Jeremy and Monica Schwittay and Jeremy's brother, Jason. She was the calf feeder, parts runner, lawn crew, babysitter, cook and overall support system, but most importantly, she held the title of Mom and Grandma. Therefore, the family decided to designate a heifer calf memorial to be awarded annually in honor of her and the morals and values she imparted on each of her family members.

"We felt like we needed to do something in her honor," Schwittay said. "We want everyone to know what a great person Mom was. She had a big heart."

Every year, the Schwittay family will award an Ayrshire calf to an individual based on their application and essay response. In the essay portion, applicants will be asked to explain why they would like to receive a registered Ayrshire heifer and their plans for the animal throughout the next several years.

"We wanted to remember Mom in some way, shape or form, while finding a way to help others and instill the values she instilled in us," Schwittay said. "We want to utilize a calf as a way to instill those morals and values into a youth, who can build life experiences through the responsibility of owning and caring for a calf."

The Schwittays milk over 300 cows, and their herd is comprised of 60% Holstein, 35% Ayrshire and 5% Jersey. Schwittay brought Ayrshires to the farm when she married Jeremy.

Growing up with Holsteins, Schwittay branched into Ayrshires when she received her first calf through the Ayrshire Breeders Association's Shayr-A-Heifer program. That was the start of her love for the breed, and she continued buying Ayrshires from the farm that donated her Shayr-A-Heifer calf. "Our family is extremely passionate about the Ayrshire breed, and we want to find someone who is interested in learning more about Ayrshires," Schwittay said. "We're looking for a youth who cares about animals, is compassionate and filled with integrity and respect – a person who will not let adversity get the best of them."

The memorial is open to youth ages 8 to 18 located anywhere in the United States. For the winning applicant, the Schwittays are looking for a motivated individual with a positive attitude.

"This is a gift we're giving to somebody with Ardis Schwittay's name attached, and we want to make sure the right person receives the gift," Schwittay said. "We want the winner to understand what a special gift this is. Wherever the calf is placed, we want to make sure she'll be well taken care of."

"This memorial is the right thing to do," Schwittay said. "This is our way of giving back, and we're doing it in honor of such a wonderful person. We hope we're making Mom proud."
