## SHOWMANSHIP CLINIC—JULY 20TH, 9 AM, AT THE FAIRGROUNDS

#### 2024 Youth Tractor and Machinery Safety Training

Who Needs To Attend the Training? Any 12 to 15-year old who may need to operate any type of farm machinery on, or across, a public road in Wisconsin. Others are welcome to attend the course, but only those older than 12 may receive certification. Those 16 years old and older without a valid driver's license can also utilize this training to be legal to drive farm machinery on public roads

In Wisconsin, 14 and 15 year-olds who have successfully passed the Wisconsin Safe Legal Review: Legal Keview: In Wisconsin, 14 and 15 year-olds who have successfully passed the Wisconsin Safe Operation of Tractor and Farm Machinery Course can legally drive farm machinery on public roads for their parents or grandparents' farms AND can work for other farms and do the same. Current Wisconsin law allows 12 and 13-year olds who have completed the course to legally operate farm machinery only when working for their parents or grandparents' farms. If you employ persons under 15 years or who do not have a driver's license, it is highly recommended that you have them attend the training, whether they drive on public roads or to the same training of the same training of the same training tr not. You may want to talk to your insurance agent to double-check about requirements based on your policy.

## REMINDER FOR CLUB GENERAL LEADERS CLUB ANNUAL FINANCIAL REPORTS (AFRs) DUE SEPTEMBER 1

As in past years, all 4-H Clubs and Groups that have a checking and/or savings account must complete and submit the following documents to their 4-H Program Educator by September 1: Wisconsin 4-H Clubs & Groups Annual Financial Report; Wisconsin 4-H Clubs & Groups Audit Checklist; A copy of the checkbook and/or savings registry covering July 1 – June 30; A copy of the bank statement ending June 30 or July 1 for each account. Any differences between the bank statement(s) and the ending balance reported must be reconciled and the reconciliation must be uploaded with the Annual Financial Report; A current inventory of land, buildings, property, or project equipment with individual values of \$2,000 or greater; and Monthly Treasurer's Reports for 4-H Clubs or Groups with annual income greater or equal to \$20,000.

This process allows the 4-H Club or Group to qualify for federal tax-exempt status under the University of Wisconsin Board of Regents General Exemption Number (GEN) for Wisconsin 4-H Clubs and Groups.

#### **ENTRY FORM REQUEST**

If you plan on entering both in the youth and open fair, please put each division on a separate entry form. Each division (youth, open and senior) are treated separately in the Fair computer program and exhibitors are issued separate exhibitor numbers.

#### FAIR PASSES

Family Fair Passes for families of youth exhibitors are still \$25 per family. Each club needs to collect a list (club name and members of each family living in the house) and money to turn into the 4-H Office no later than August 1. NOTE: The Family Pass only includes immediate family members living in the same household. Please make checks payable to: <u>Marinette</u> <u>County Fair</u>.

#### MEAL TICKET INFO FOR FOOD STAND

Meal tickets are still \$50 this year. Only youth exhibitors (including FFA) and leaders will be able to purchase meal tickets. Parents of the youth exhibitors will not be able to purchase them unless they are leaders. Please make checks payable to: <u>Marinette County 4-H.</u>

•There is no breakfast included this year.

•Lunch and dinner will need to be used on the <u>same day</u> assigned. They will need to be used up by 9:00 pm of that day and 4:00 pm on Sunday. NOTE: There will be <u>NO sharing</u> of meal passes.

## FOOD STAND DRESS ETIQUETTE - FROM THE FOOD STAND COMMITTEE

Hats must be worn and hair pulled back. Do not wear flip flops, sandals, short shorts nor mini skirts. Comfortable closed toe shoes should be worn. T-shirts or sleeved shirts must be worn; NO spaghetti straps permitted.

## **MEMBERS WORKING AT FOOD STAND**

Members **must work a full shift** or more or contact the Extension office to do alternative positions to receive some of the awards or travel. The basic guidelines are as follows (Parents should not work a member's shift for the member to receive the credit):

1. 4-H members (3<sup>rd</sup> grade and up) are encouraged to work a shift in the food stand.

2. Members purchasing meal passes must work a full shift in the food stand.

3. Members participating in the county-sponsored event form activities must work a full shift in the food stand and are strongly encouraged to work an extra shift at the fair or help with set up on Wednesday before the Fair or clean up on Sunday evening of the Fair or, if needed, during the Fair.

4. Clubs should wait at the back door of the food stand when their shift will be starting to get instructions from the food stand manager before the shift starts.

All members/people working in the stand need to be working during their shift. You need to eat before or after your shift, no leaving during your shift to eat.
 Drinks are not free while you are working in the

stand or at any other time.

REMEMBER: NO DRINKING/EATING DURING YOUR SHIFT.

Take care to fill out food stand sign-up sheets as they will be checked after the Fair to verify volunteer obligations. If you are not available to help during your club's shift at the food stand, contact the 4-H office for an alternative volunteer opportunity.

Shifts available to clubs to work at the Food Stand can be found at the end of this newsletter. Help is also needed on Wednesday, August 21; will have limited menu.



## COUNTY FAIR ENTRIES TO BE BROUGHT A DAY EARLIER AGAIN

Entry times will be from 12-8 pm on Wednesday, August 21, for non-animal items, rabbit/poultry entry times will be 4-7 pm, and all other animals will be 9 am-12 pm on Thursday, August 22. Face to face judging will take place from noon until 8 pm on Wed.

## **YOUTH CLUB FLOWER DISPLAYS**

An entry consists of two pots with flowers planted in them. Each club may have one entry. They will be judged on Wed., Aug. 21.

## VET SCIENCE, EXOTIC ANIMALS, DOG, CAT, POCKET PETS (NOT RABBITS)

Dogs, caged birds, guinea pigs, hamsters, and cat projects will be judged face-to-face the Saturday before the Fair, on *August 17*, at the Fairgrounds.

## FACE TO FACE JUDGING

Face-to-face judging provides an opportunity for the youth to communicate with the judge (one-on-one) on details of his or her exhibit. This judging style gives the judge the opportunity to directly ask questions. It provides an opportunity to understand why the exhibit was selected for construction, if there were any problems with it & tools used to create the exhibit. The judge can then use this discussion to decide the placing.

#### **PREPARING YOUR ITEMS TO EXHIBIT**

Be sure to read the rules in the Fair premium listing. Entry tags need to be securely attached before judging. Remove and keep the bottom part of the entry tag. It is used as a claim check to pick up your items on Sunday at 5 p.m.

## ATTENTION ANIMAL EXHIBITORS

■When entering your animal for the Fair, also list a nonanimal exhibit or poster in that particular project, in case your animal gets sick so that you can still have something entered.

If you are showing two or more different animals, talk to the Superintendents involved so that classes can be adjusted for everyone to exhibit.

■If you are a dairy, livestock &/or horse exhibitor, please remember to keep trash out of the manure at the Fair. This inc. cans, paper cups, twine, wire, medication containers & needles. Please use the trash barrels in the barns.

### **CLOVERBUDS**

These young members do not need to submit entry forms to show at the Fair. They do need to fill out a 3"x5" card w/name, age, club, & item being entered, and take it to the Clothing Bldg. Cloverbuds will have faceto-face judging from noon to 8 pm on Wed. or you can drop off the items without seeing the judge. Cloverbuds may enter up to eight items.
