FAIR PASSES

Family Fair Passes for families of youth exhibitors are still \$25 per family. Each club needs to collect a list (club name and members of each family living in the house) and money to turn into the 4-H Office no later than August 1. NOTE: The Family Pass only includes immediate family members living in the same household. Please make checks payable to: <u>Marinette</u> <u>County Fair</u>.

FAIR ENTRY FORMS AND PREMIUM BOOKS

By now, 4-H members should have received their preprinted fair entry forms. If not, please check with your club's general leader.

ENTRY FORM REQUEST

If you plan on entering both in the youth and open fair, please put each division on a separate entry form. Each division (youth, open and senior) are treated separately in the Fair computer program and exhibitors are issued separate exhibitor numbers.

VET SCIENCE, EXOTIC ANIMALS, DOG, CAT, POCKET PETS (NOT RABBITS)

Dogs, caged birds, guinea pigs, hamsters, and cat projects will be judged face-to-face the Saturday before the Fair, on *August 16*, at the Fairgrounds.

ATTENTION ANIMAL EXHIBITORS

■When entering your animal for the Fair, also list a nonanimal exhibit or poster in that particular project, in case your animal gets sick so that you can still have something entered.

If you are showing two or more different animals, talk to the Superintendents involved so that classes can be adjusted for everyone to exhibit.

■If you are a dairy, livestock &/or horse exhibitor, please remember to keep trash out of the manure at the Fair. This inc. cans, paper cups, twine, wire, medication containers & needles. Please use the trash barrels in the barns.

CLOVERBUDS

These young members do not need to submit entry forms to show at the Fair. They do need to fill out a 3"x5" card w/name, age, club, & item being entered, and take it to the Clothing Bldg. Cloverbuds will have faceto-face judging from noon to 8 pm on Wed. or you can drop off the items without seeing the judge. Cloverbuds may enter up to eight items.

CAMPING NEAR THE FAIRGROUNDS

4-H families wanting to camp during the Fair may call the Village Clerk at 715-856-5341 to camp at Evergreen Park, in Wausaukee. The park is across the creek on the north side of the Fairgrounds.

MEAL TICKET INFO FOR FOOD STAND

Meal tickets are still \$50 this year. Only youth exhibitors (including FFA) and leaders will be able to purchase meal tickets. Parents of the youth exhibitors will not be able to purchase them unless they are leaders. Please make checks payable to: <u>Marinette County 4-H.</u>

•There is no breakfast included with the meal ticket this year, only lunch and dinner.

•Lunch and dinner will need to be used on the <u>same day</u> assigned. They will need to be used up by 9:00 pm of that day and 4:00 pm on Sunday. NOTE: There will be <u>NO sharing of meal passes</u>.

NOTE: The food stand will offer breakfast again on Friday and Saturday morning only, but this is NOT IN-CLUDED with the meal ticket.

FOOD STAND DRESS ETIQUETTE - FROM THE FOOD STAND COMMITTEE

Hats must be worn and hair pulled back. Do not wear flip flops, sandals, short shorts nor mini skirts. Comfortable closed toe shoes should be worn. T-shirts or sleeved shirts must be worn; NO spaghetti straps permitted.

MEMBERS WORKING AT FOOD STAND

Members **must work a full shift** or more or contact the Extension office to do alternative positions to receive some of the awards or travel. The basic guidelines are as follows (Parents should not work a member's shift for the member to receive the credit):

1. 4-H members (3rd grade and up) are encouraged to work a shift in the food stand.

2. Members purchasing meal passes must work a full shift in the food stand.

3. Members participating in the county-sponsored event form activities must work a full shift in the food stand and are strongly encouraged to work an extra shift at the fair or help with set up on Tuesday before the Fair, Wednesday morning (as the food stand will be open on Wednesday afternoon with a limited menu) or clean up on Sunday evening of the Fair or, if needed, during the Fair.

4. Clubs should wait at the back door of the food stand when their shift will be starting to get instructions from the food stand manager before the shift starts.

5. All members/people working in the stand need to be working during their shift. You need to eat before or after your shift, no leaving during your shift to eat.6. Drinks are not free while you are working in the stand or at any other time.

REMEMBER: NO DRINKING/EATING DURING YOUR SHIFT.



Take care to fill out food stand sign-up sheets as they will be checked after the Fair to verify volunteer obligations. If you are not available to help during your club's shift at the food stand, contact the 4-H office for an alternative volunteer opportunity.

Shifts available to clubs to work at the Food Stand can be found at the end of this newsletter. Help is also needed on Wednesday, August 20; will have limited menu.

LIVESTOCK COSTUME CONTEST

FACE TO FACE JUDGING

Face-to-face judging provides an opportunity for the youth to communicate with the judge (one-on-one) on details of his or her exhibit. This judging style gives the judge the opportunity to directly ask questions. It provides an opportunity to understand why the exhibit was selected for construction, if there were any problems with it & tools used to create the exhibit. The judge can then use this discussion to decide the placing.

PREPARING YOUR ITEMS TO EXHIBIT

Be sure to read the rules in the Fair premium listing. Entry tags need to be securely attached before judging. Remove and keep the bottom part of the entry tag. It is used as a claim check to pick up your items on Sunday at 5 p.m.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT TIMES TO BRING ANIMALS TO THE FAIRGROUNDS

All animals entered in livestock performance (auction) classes are required to be at the Fairgrounds between 3-7 pm on Wed., August 20, 2025. Rabbit and poultry entries must also be brought to the Fairgrounds Wed., Aug. 20, 2025 from 3-7 pm. All other animals (except for horses) may be brought at this time as well, but are not required to be brought until noon 12 pm on Thursday, August 21, 2025. Horses will be entered from 9 am-noon on Thursday, August 21, 2025.

COGGINS TEST REQUIRED FOR HORSES

All horses must have the current calendar year Coggins test to exhibit at the county fair and state horse show.

Horses showing any symptoms of contagious or infectious disease will NOT be permitted to exhibit. Check other rules and regulations in the Fair Premium List and separate Dept. 6 Horse Updated List which you received last month.

REMEMBER the 4-H Fair Food Stand is one of the main sources of income for 4-H. Each club must sign up for at least one shift. **Clubs with 10 or more members over the age of 10 need to sign up for two (2) time shifts (younger kids can work during both shifts).** All regular members are expected to work. One teen or adult is needed to help in the kitchen. Each club should have two adults to work with their members. Clubs with only young members and/or few members should sign up for the early morning shifts or work with another club. LARGER CLUBS ARE ASKED TO TAKE BUSIER SHIFTS, FRIDAY & SATURDAY. Clubs NOT signing up for a shift will be assigned a shift that has been left vacant. Below, please list your first, second and third choice. Be sure to list both the day and time shift. The times scheduled will be on a first come, first served basis.
