MARINETTE, OCONTO AND WAUPACA COUNTIES HERB KOHL LEARNING JOUR-NEY TRIP TO WASHINGTON D.C. - ANTIC-IPATED TRAVEL DATES THE WEEK OF JULY 21, 2025

Thanks to the generosity of a Herb Kohl Philanthropies educational experience grant, we are able to provide the opportunity for 40 Marinette, Oconto, and Waupaca County 4-H youth, ages 13-17 (at time of travel), to Washington D.C. during the week of July 21st (exact dates/time of travel will be shared shortly.)

More about the experience...

The Washington D.C. Learning Journey is a grant funded opportunity through the Herb Kohl Philanthropies (HKP). Due to the nature of the grant, the opportunity for this learning journey is primarily for youth who have not experienced travel to Washington D.C. Youth who have attended Washington D.C. on other experiences (school, 4-H

etc.) are welcome to still apply, but please know priority will be given to those who have not been to Washington D.C. before.

We will travel to Washington D.C. the week of July 21st (details are still being worked on). The group will meet in Green Bay, be bussed to the Milwaukee Regional Airport where we will fly to Washington D.C. as a group. Exact dates and times are currently being worked out with our travel agent, however with our timeline we need to start applications now. We will keep everyone updated as we are able.

Other requirements of the grant are to attend the U.S. Capitol Building and go on a college tour. There is a strong chance the group will be touring the University of Maryland. We will also be going on a general tour of Washington D.C. including monuments, Smithsonian Museums and more. There will be a good balance of STEM, Citizenship

and History learning opportunities. The final itinerary has not been set yet.

Youth will be roomed by gender in hotel rooms and the tour company provides overnight security. There will be four youth in a room as this is what the grant provides. The grant provides meals (\$10/meal) and are coordinated at fast food restaurants.

There will be a minimal cost to families to assist in covering group t-shirts, snacks, bottled water, the coach bus to the airport etc. The remainder of the cost (travel, hotel, food etc.) will be covered by HKP.


2025 FAIR CHANGES FOR LIVESTOCK

This year, both tags required for your animals will be provided from the fair. The cost for tags will be \$3.00 per animal (so no more paying for another tag if you do lose one). One tag will be an RFID tag and the other will be the regular tag. If your animal already has a farm tag, it will then have 3 tags instead of 2.

All auction animals will need to be brought in Wednesday of fair week, time is still to be determined. Other animals may be brought in at this time as well, but only auction animals are required on Wednesday for 2025. All non-auction animals must be in place by noon on Thursday of fair week. Beef show will happen on Thursday afternoon at 12:30pm. Rabbits will immediately follow the beef show.

There will be more changes that have been approved, but they won't start until 2026.

One change for 2026 is that all auction exhibitors will be required to volunteer at least 3 hours at the fairgrounds as documented by a fair board member or designee. While this is required for 2026, it is highly encouraged for 2025.
