Thanks to the generosity of a Herb Kohl Philanthropies educational experience grant, we are able to provide the opportunity for 40 Marinette, Oconto, and Waupaca County 4-H youth, ages 13-17 (at time of travel), to Washington D.C. during the week of July 21st (exact dates/time of travel will be shared shortly.)

Due to the nature of the grant, the opportunity for this learning journey is primarily for youth who have not experienced travel to Washington D.C.

The grant provides meals (\$10/meal) and are coordinated at fast food restaurants.
