RETURNING 4-H ADULT VOLUNTEERS DEADLINE FOR TRAININGS/SCREENINGS—PLEASE READ

All returning Wisconsin 4-H volunteers were required to re-enroll between September 1 and November 1. All required trainings and background checks must be completed by December 1. Until you have completed the required training and background check, you are not considered an approved 4-H volunteer and you are not covered by the liability coverage provided to volunteers of the University of Wisconsin Madison Division of Extension if an incident or injury occurs while you perform volunteer duties in 4-H. Adults who are not approved 4-H volunteers cannot be in custodial care of youth.

The University of Wisconsin Madison Division of Extension provides equal opportunities in employment and programming in compliance with state and federal law.

ASSOCIATION BOARD ELECTIONS - SEEKING TO FILL OFFICER POSITIONS

Board elections will be held during Achievement Day/ Leader Recognition. Association meetings are held at 6:30 p.m. on the 3rd Monday of every month (rotating locations) with the exception of Aug. & Dec. (no meeting). In addition to descriptions below, board member responsibilities include planning the annual 4-H calendar & annual budget & working with Extension Program Educator to determine 4-H policies and goals, determine training needs, make decisions about the county 4-H program and carry out other business of the Association. This is a great way to get involved!

President: (two year term) Presides at all meetings of the Leaders Association and acts as Chair of Board meetings. President and Extension Program Educator work together to solve problems and plan educational opportunities.

Secretary: (two year term) Keeps minutes of all meetings of the Leaders Association & turns them into the 4-H office for the newsletter. Brings copy of minutes to each meeting. Works with the Extension Office in getting out correspondence/communications when necessary.

The 4-H Charter indicates that a 4-H Club or Group is organized in accordance with the objectives of the WI 4-H program. The University of WI-Madison, Division of Extension grants 4-H Charters which formally authorizes a WI 4-H Club or Group to use the 4-H Name and Emblem for educational purposes in accordance with laws and regulations established by Congress and the U.S. Department of Agriculture. 4-H Charters are renewed annually and will be granted upon successful completion of the Wisconsin 4-H Charter Application.

Failure to submit a completed Wisconsin 4-H Clubs & Groups Charter Application by the due date could result in the 4-H Club or Group being dissolved.

2025-26 PROJECT YEAR BEGINS OCT. 1

Our new enrollment year for 2026 began on October 1.

Leaders had to re-enroll by November 1 and members must re-enroll each year by November 30. Regular members must be in 3rd grade or older.

Cloverbuds (children in 5K through 2nd grade) should be listed in your club enrollment. Cloverbuds can participate in club activities. They can exhibit at the County Fair, only in the Cloverbud category, and do not receive premiums.

*New members can join at any time, but must enroll by May 1 to enter in the Fair.

*May 1 is also the deadline to add or drop projects.

*You must be enrolled in a project in order to exhibit at the Fair in that project.

We hope that your 4-H club will have a special promotion to tell the benefits of 4-H in your respective communities this fall. Invite your friends to join!!

4-H TRIPS

Teens interested in attending trips should fill out the Marinette County Sponsored Event Application. First round was due Oct. 1.
