# ASSOCIATION BOARD ELECTIONS - SEEKING TO FILL OFFICER POSITIONS

Board elections will be held during Achievement Day/ Leader Recognition. Association meetings are held at 6:30 p.m. on the 3rd Monday of every month (rotating locations) with the exception of Aug. & Dec. (no meeting). In addition to descriptions below, board member responsibilities include planning the annual 4-H calendar & annual budget & working with Extension Program Educator to determine 4-H policies and goals, determine training needs, make decisions about the county 4-H program and carry out other business of the Association. This is a great way to get involved!

Vice President: Presides in the absence of the President and takes care of all the President's duties during the absence.

Secretary: (2 year term) Keeps minutes of all meetings of the Leaders Association & turns them into the 4-H office for the newsletter. Brings copy of minutes to each meeting. Works with the Extension Office in getting out correspondence/communications when necessary.

Treasurer: Collects and cares for all money of the Leaders Association, including camp account. Shall pay bills of the Leaders Association as approved by the board of directors. Assists with budget planning.

# TRACTOR SUPPLY (TSC) PAPER CLOVER PROMOTION UPDATE

The Paper Clover Campaign has been moved to: November 29 – December 15, 2024

The In-Store Promotion opportunity sign up is now open. The Tractor Supply Company (TSC) has worked with 4-H for the past several years by coordinating a paper clover campaign held twice each year. Proceeds from the sale of paper clovers at each Wisconsin TSC store go to the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation to be used for leadership programming and financial aid assistance.

The WI 4-H Foundation will provide an incentive to any 4-H club or individual 4-H member who does an in-store promotion at a TSC store during the Fall/Winter 2024 Paper Clover Campaign.

A \$50 TSC gift card will be given to any club who completes an in-store promotion and a \$25 TSC gift card will be given to any 4-H member who completes an in-store promotion during this Paper Clover Campaign. Online registration is required.

Guidelines include:

- \*Any Wisconsin 4-H club or individual member may reserve ONE promotion date.
- \*Promotion reservations are available for each Saturday or Sunday of the Paper Clover Campaign (Nov. 30, Dec.1, 7, 8, 14, 15, 2024). The timing of the promotion is determined by the Store Manager.
- \*Only one club or individual may do an in-store promotion at any store at one time. Time slots are filled on a first-come, first-served basis.
- \*To reserve a date, click on the link below. Fill out the reservation form (all fields are required).
- \*When you have confirmed your date, the club or individual MUST get Store Manager permission to do the promotion. The Store Manager will provide info about what is allowed, timing, location, etc.

CLAIMING YOUR REWARD: When the promotion is completed, in order to receive your reward, clubs/individuals must email a photo of the activity (but several photos are appreciated!) within 30 days, and the WI 4-H Foundation will send the gift card to the address provided on the reservation form. Photos may

be used for marketing purposes and on social media.

### 2024-25 PROJECT YEAR BEGAN OCT. 1

Our new enrollment year for 2025 began on October 1.

Members and leaders must re-enroll each year by November 30. Regular members must be in 3rd grade or older.

Cloverbuds (children in 5K through 2nd grade) should be listed in your club enrollment. Cloverbuds can participate in club activities. They can exhibit at the County Fair, only in the Cloverbud category, and do not receive premiums.

Re-enrollment deadline is November 30, 2024.

- \*New members can join at any time, but must enroll by May 1 to enter in the Fair.
- \*May 1 is also the deadline to add or drop projects.
- \*You must be enrolled in a project in order to exhibit at the Fair in that project.

We hope that your 4-H club will have a special promotion to tell the benefits of 4-H in your respective communities this fall. Invite your friends to join!!

#### **4-H TRIPS**

Teens interested in attending trips should fill out the Marinette County Sponsored Event Application. First round was due Oct. 1. All information regarding age requirements and trips was included in the leaders packet at the Fair. Following that, applications are due Feb. 1 and with interviews at the Feb. 4-H Association Meeting.

### WI 4-H CHARTERS DUE NOVEMBER 1

This past week, charter information was sent either by e-mail or snail mail to general club leaders.

The 4-H Charter indicates that a 4-H Club or Group is organized in accordance with the objectives of the WI 4-H program. The University of WI-Madison, Division of Extension grants 4-H Charters which formally authorizes a WI 4-H Club or Group to use the 4-H Name and Emblem for educational purposes in accordance with laws and regulations established by Congress and the U.S. Department of Agriculture. In addition, the 4-H Charter Application provides:

- \*Documentation of educational activities of the 4-H Club or Group/Committee needed for liability coverage for 4-H volunteers and members
- \*Program impact evaluation and educational planning \*Documentation of compliance by 4-H Clubs and Groups with EEO, ADA guidelines, and Civil Rights laws.
- 4-H Charters are renewed annually and will be granted upon successful completion of the Wisconsin 4-H Charter Application.

The Wisconsin 4-H Charter Application deadline is November 1 for returning 4-H Clubs and Groups.

Failure to submit a completed Wisconsin 4-H Clubs & Groups Charter Application by the due date could result in the 4-H Club or Group being dissolved.
