Happy Fall Everyone! A brand-new 4-H year is here! That means it's time to re-enroll and get ready for another season filled with learning, friendships, and growth. You will find more information about re-enrollment in this newsletter, please don't hesitate to reach out with any questions. Every Club should have completed and submitted their annual financial paperwork and begin working on their planning and charter materials so we can set a strong foundation for the year ahead.

This issue of the newsletter is full of information about exciting opportunities coming up for youth and families—be sure to look inside and mark your calendars!

I'd like to take a moment to continue to celebrate someone very special. Our amazing Marinette County Extension support staff member, Nancy Servais, is marking 50 years of dedicated service and will be celebrated by UW-Madison, Division of Extension this month. Nancy has been a steady and welcoming presence for Marinette County Extension and 4-H, her contributions have truly shaped the success of our programs. Please join me in congratulating and thanking her for this incredible milestone!

I also want to share an update about the 4-H Program staffing. A few months ago, due to some change in staffing in Oconto County, they took some time to analyze their priorities and made the decision to ensure that the Teen Court program remains strong and continues to thrive. To support this, the program has been placed under the Positive Youth Development Institute, and the Oconto County position has been expanded to a full-time role overseeing both Oconto County 4-H and Oconto County Teen Court. I will be staying in Oconto County assuming the expanded 1.0 role.

Marinette County will continue to support having a 0.5 4-H Positive Youth Development Educator position which is currently posted and will be filled as soon as possible. Until then, I will continue to oversee Marinette County's 4-H program. Larger dual-county and multi-county events will continue as planned, and I am excited to collaborate with the new educator once hired on cross-county programming where it makes sense.

It has been a true joy to work with the volunteers, members, and families of Marinette County 4-H. I want you to know how invested I am in this program and how much I care about each of you. Thank you for all you do to make 4-H strong in your county. I look forward to continuing to support you and your new educator during this time of transition and celebrating all the great things to come.

ATTENTION RETURNING 4-H ADULT VOLUNTEERS—PLEASE READ

According to Wisconsin 4-H policy—"All returning Wisconsin 4-H volunteers are required to re-enroll annually between September 1 and November 1. All required trainings and background checks must be completed by December 1." Until you have completed the required training and background check, you are not considered an approved 4-H volunteer and you are not covered by the liability coverage provided to volunteers of the University of Wisconsin Madison Division of Extension if an incident or injury occurs while you perform volunteer duties in 4-H. Adults who are not approved 4-H volunteers cannot be in custodial care of youth.

The University of Wisconsin Madison Division of Extension provides equal opportunities in employment and programming in compliance with state and federal law.

ASSOCIATION BOARD ELECTIONS - SEEKING TO FILL OFFICER POSITIONS



President: (two year term) Presides at all meetings of the Leaders Association and acts as Chair of Board meetings. President and Extension Program Educator work together to solve problems and plan educational opportunities.

Secretary: (2 year term) Keeps minutes of all meetings of the Leaders Association & turns them into the 4-H office for the newsletter. Brings copy of minutes to each meeting. Works with the Extension Office in getting out correspondence/communications when necessary.

CHANGES TO PROJECT LISTINGS

At the end of this newsletter, you will find an updated listing of projects. Quite a few projects have been combined into a new listing. Projects in the left column are projects offered in the past. In the right column, is the list of current updated project areas that members can take which references the old project. This resource provides a list of past project titles and what youth and families would sign up for now in the new project list.

2025-26 PROJECT YEAR BEGINS OCT. 1

Our new enrollment year for 2026 begins on October 1.

Leaders must re-enroll by November 1 and members must re-enroll each year by November 30. Regular members must be in 3rd grade or older.

Cloverbuds (children in 5K through 2nd grade) should be listed in your club enrollment. Cloverbuds can participate in club activities. They can exhibit at the County Fair, only in the Cloverbud category, and do not receive premiums.

*New members can join at any time, but must enroll by May 1 to enter in the Fair.

*May 1 is also the deadline to add or drop projects.

*You must be enrolled in a project in order to exhibit at the Fair in that project.

We hope that your 4-H club will have a special promotion to tell the benefits of 4-H in your respective communities this fall. Invite your friends to join!!

4-H TRIPS

Teens interested in attending trips should fill out the Marinette County Sponsored Event Application. First round was due Oct. 1. All information regarding age requirements and trips was included in the leaders packet at the Fair. Following that, applications are due Feb. 1 and with interviews at the Feb. 4-H Association Meeting.

WI 4-H CHARTERS DUE NOVEMBER 1


The 4-H Charter indicates that a 4-H Club or Group is organized in accordance with the objectives of the WI 4-H program. The University of WI-Madison, Division of Extension grants 4-H Charters which formally authorizes a WI 4-H Club or Group to use the 4-H Name and Emblem for educational purposes in accordance with laws and regulations established by Congress and the U.S. Department of Agriculture. In addition, the 4-H Charter Application provides:

- *Documentation of educational activities of the 4-H Club or Group/Committee needed for liability coverage for 4-H volunteers and members
- *Program impact evaluation and educational planning
- *Documentation of compliance by 4-H Clubs and Groups with EEO, ADA guidelines, and Civil Rights laws.

4-H Charters are renewed annually and will be granted upon successful completion of the Wisconsin 4-H Charter Application.

The Wisconsin 4-H Charter Application deadline is November 1 for returning 4-H Clubs and Groups.

Failure to submit a completed Wisconsin 4-H Clubs & Groups Charter Application by the due date could result in the 4-H Club or Group being dissolved.
