FOUR STEPS TO BECOMING A 4-H VOLUNTEER

Youth are our most precious resource and I'm sure you join me in taking their protection and safety very seriously. All 4-H youth development volunteers are required to complete 4 steps <u>before</u> volunteering with youth.

- 1) Annually signing the Volunteer Behavior Expectation & Assumption of Risk (done as part of the on-line enrollment.)
- 2) Participating in face-to-face VIP (Volunteer in Preparation) training provided by UW-Extension. (Only once.)
- 3) Pass a criminal background check. (Initial and every four years.)
- 4) Complete UWEX Volunteer Mandated Reporter Training (on-line).

New volunteers should call the 4-H office to schedule face-to-face VIP training.
