4-H ASSOCIATION BOARD ELECTIONS

Board elections for Vice President, Treasurer and Secretary will be held during Achievement Day/Leader Recognition on Sat., Nov. 10. Terms begin in January, 2019. Association meetings are held at 6:30 p.m. on the 3rd Monday of every month (rotating locations) with the exception of August and December (no meeting). In addition to descriptions below, board member responsibilities include planning the annual 4-H calendar and annual budget and working with UW-Extension Coordinator to determine 4-H policies and goals, determine training needs, make decisions about the county 4-H program and carry out other business of the Association. This is a great way to get involved! Vice President: Presides in the absence of the President and takes care of all the President's duties during the absence.

Treasurer: Collects and cares for all money of the Leaders Association, including camp account. Shall pay bills of the Leaders Association as approved by the board of directors. Assists with budget planning.

Secretary: (one year term) Keeps minutes of all meetings of the Leaders Association and turns them into the UWEX Office for the 4-H newsletter. Brings copy of minutes to each meeting. Works with the UW-Extension Office in getting out correspondence and communications when necessary.

Would you like to learn more and how they relate to your role as a leader working with youth?

Check out how you as an adult volunteer or youth leader can foster the development of these elements in the youth. You will have an opportunity to:

•Learn about each element in relation to different age youth from kindergarten to high school.

•Consider how you can develop life skills in youth •Build on what you know to foster the growth of these elements in young people

Each module is about 7 - 10 minutes in length. You move through the module at your own pace. It will take you about 30 - 45 minutes to complete all four modules. See instructions at the end of this newsletter.

BECOMING A 4-H VOLUNTEER - FOUR STEPS

All 4-H youth development volunteers are required to complete 4 steps before volunteering with youth.

1. Enroll and annually sign the Volunteer Behavior Expectation and Assumption of Risk (done as part of online enrollment). Your club leader can help you.

2. Pass a criminal background check (initial and every four years). Within a couple weeks of completing your online enrollment, you will receive an email from GIS.

3. Participate in a face-to-face VIP (Volunteer in Preparation) training provided by UW-Extension Coordinator (attend only once). Contact 715-732-7514.

4. Complete UWEX Volunteer Mandated Reporter Training (done online, given access at VIP training).

RE-ENROLLMENT IN 4-H

The 2018-2019 project year begins on Oct. 1. You can drop/add projects until May 1. New members can join anytime and take exhibits to the Fair if enrollments are in by May 1, 2019. Re-enrollments should be complete by November 30th. At that time, the insurance is ordered.

What is a project? Every subject listed in the Project Selection Guide is a project.

Notes:

• Cloverbud age is 5K through 2nd grade. Cloverbuds enroll in the Cloverbud project only.

• At grade 3, you can join 4-H and enroll in one to three projects & can do a record book on projects. In the 4-H Project Guide, read the project descriptions to select a project. Some projects have more than one skill level. Select the skill level (lowest number) that fits. You will be judged at this level at the Fair. Members are encouraged to exhibit at least one item per project at the Fair. Do not enroll in more than one skill level. For example, in Dairy, you can exhibit any age animal at the Fair in Dairy 1, 2 or 3.

• Members may graduate from 4-H the year they graduate from high school or the following year.

All enrolled 4-H members and Cloverbuds, grades 5K & up, are covered for certain 4-H events. If you have an injury during a 4-H event, call the 4-H office immediately for a report form. You must report your injury within 20 davs.

4-H FOUNDATION LICENSE PLATES

Available now. The 4-H Foundation license plate fees include an issuance fee of \$15, plus an annual \$25 taxdeductible contribution, in addition to the regular registration fee. This contribution goes to the WI 4-H Foundation. Vehicles that qualify: automobiles, motor homes (annual registration only), and motor trucks (4,500; 6,000; or 8,000 lbs gross weight inc. dual purpose farm and dual purpose motor home; and, 12,000 lbs gross weight farm truck).

In addition to the fees mentioned above when you request these plates, you pay the regular registration fee for your vehicle if your current plates expire within three months or you have no plates. YOUTH AS PARTNERS IN CIVIC LEADERSHIP

Nov. 9-11, at Upham Woods Outdoor Learning Center, in Wisconsin Dells. The mission of the Youth as Partners in Civic Leadership Conference (YPCL) is to advance youth voice in Wisconsin by increasing the capacity for youth and adults to share civic leadership in local communities, schools and organizations. We advocate for a youth voice and build mentoring, networking and learning opportunities.

Who should attend? Teams of high-school-age youth (ages 14-18) and adults (21 or older) sharing decision-making roles in communities, schools and organizations (19 to 20 year olds are also welcome but should register as adults.) Groups are limited to 10 people with the preferred ratio of 4 youth to one adult.

How do I register? Identify a team of youth and adults who intend to work together after the conference. Registration cost is \$120, which includes meals and lodging. Online Essential Elements Training For 4-H Volunteers

Created: August 23, 2018

OVERVIEW

Through 4HOnline, members and volunteers can take county and state required trainings anywhere they have internet access. These instructions walk them through the steps to access these trainings.

SOFTWARE REQUIREMENTS

There are no special software requirements except to use an updated browser (Google's Chrome and Apple's Safari work the best for this training).

SIGNING UP FOR THE TRAINING

- 1. Log into 4HOnline at <u>http://wi.4honline.com</u> with your family login.
- 2. Click on the Continue to Family button.
- 3. In the family Member/Volunteer List, click on **Edit** for your name.
- 4. Under the blue bar below the UW-Extension logo, click on Trainings.
- If you have already signed up for the training, click on the Edit/View button and skip to step 7; otherwise click on the Sign Up for a Training button.
- 6. Click on the **Sign Up** button next to the training you wish to enroll in.
