





SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE

WI 4-H FOUNDATION 2021 SCHOLARSHIPS

The Foundation will award more than \$15,000 in scholarships to outstanding WI students pursuing higher education. Applications must be received via e-mail by *March 15, 2021*. To be eligible for Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships students must have been a Wisconsin 4-H member for at least three years; have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college or technical school during the 2021-2022 academic school year. CO. 4-H LEADERS ASSOC. SCHOLARSHIPS

To be eligible, you must have been in Marinette County 4-H at least four years and be a 4-H graduate of Marinette County or eligible to graduate. Open to high school seniors, freshmen and sophomores in post-secondary education, including college, university or technical school and a full-time student. Scholarship applications are available in the Extension office. Deadline: *March 1*.

WI TOWNS ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP

The WI Towns Association, Rural Mutual Insurance Company & Scott Construction, Inc., will be awarding \$7,000 in scholarships to high school seniors graduating in 2021 from a public or private high school in WI that plan to enroll in a WI public or private college or a university in 2021. The winners are determined by independent judging of an essay contest. The essay should address the topic: "What lessons can town governments take from the COVID-19 pandemic to improve their emergency management systems and prepare for and respond to future disasters?" GROWMARK AGRICULTURAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Foundation is offering 15 \$1,500 scholarships for students in the USA & Ontario, Canada, pursuing degrees or certification in an ag-related field. At the time of application, students must be high school seniors or equivalent, or continuing students enrolled in good standing at a college, university, or technical school. Scholarships will be awarded based on information including academic achievement, school and community involvement, and essay responses. The application should be completed in full online, including submission of a current photograph and your most recent semester's transcript. No incomplete or late applications will be considered. Applications are due by midnight (Central Time) on April 15.

GREENSTONE FARM CREDIT SERVICES SCHOLARSHIP

Incoming college freshman pursuing a degree in an agriculture-related field can now apply. Students attending a four-year college program can earn a \$2,000 scholarship, while \$1,000 awards will go to selected students attending a two-year college program. Completed applications must be submitted by **February 28, 2021** and students interested in applying must meet the applicant eligibility: Applicants must reside within GreenStone's territory (MI & northeast WI); Must be a full-time high school graduating senior; Have at least a 3.0 grade point average. UNITED COOPERATIVE SCHOLARSHIP

This program awards \$1,000 scholarships to 40-50 high school seniors and current college/technical school students who are continuing their full-time education in 2021-2022. At least 10 of the scholarships will be awarded to students majoring in an ag field, at least 10 will be awarded to students attending a technical school, and at least 10 will be awarded to current college or technical school students who are continuing their full-time education in 2021-2022.
