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

FALL FORUM 2021



TRACTOR SUPPLY COMPANY FALL PAPER CLOVER CAMPAIGN

October 6-17. For every \$1 paper clover sold at a TSC in WI, 90 cents comes back to the WI 4-H Foundation to be used for leadership activities. If your club partners with your local TSC to promote 4-H at the store, the Foundation will give your club \$50. You must register with the WI 4-H Foundation (Joanne@Wis4HFoundation.org) before your event because \$50 is awarded to only one club per store. Note: TSC is prohibiting in store displays. However, each manager can make decisions about permitting outdoor displays, so call the store.



ASSOCIATION BOARD ELECTIONS - SEEKING TO FILL ALL OFFICER POSITIONS

Board elections will be held during Achievement Day/ Leader Recognition on Sun., December 5. Terms begin in January. Association meetings are held at 6:30 p.m. on the 3rd Monday of every month (rotating locations) with the exception of Aug. & Dec. (no meeting). In addition to descriptions below, board member responsibilities include planning the annual 4-H calendar & annual budget & working with Extension Program Educator to determine 4-H policies and goals, determine training needs, make decisions about the county 4-H program and carry out other business of the Association. This is a great way to get involved!

President: (two year term) Presides at all meetings of the Leaders Association and acts as Chair of Board meetings. President and Extension Program Educator work together to solve problems and plan educational opportunities.

Secretary: (two year term) Keeps minutes of all meetings of the Leaders Association and turns them into the 4-H Office for the 4-H newsletter. Brings copy of minutes to each meeting. Works with the Extension Office in getting out correspondence and communications when necessary.

Youth Reps (2): (1 or 2 year term) Works as active member together with other board members and 4-H Program Educator in a youth-adult partnership model including attending regular meetings, collaborating on 4-H Leader Association projects, providing input & making decisions, & setting goals for the county 4-H program. Representatives should be at least 12 years old.

Board elections for Vice President and Treasurer were to be held during Achievement Day/Leader Recognition on Sun., July 11. Due to low turnout, elections had been postponed.

Vice President: Presides in the absence of the President and takes care of all the President's duties during the absence.

Treasurer: Collects and cares for all money of the Leaders Association, including camp account. Shall pay bills of the Leaders Association as approved by the board of directors. Assists with budget planning.

RECORD BOOK PROCESS & DATES

The purpose of a record book is to: 1) set goals for yourself; 2) share and record what you've learned; 3) reflect on accomplishments or give thought to how you may or may not do something differently next time. It is also the current way to apply for several county-wide awards. Record books are not associated with fair checks in any way. Please see the "My Record Book Guide" and "Record Book Check Sheet" that was attached to August's newsletter. Be careful to include all activities you participated in. Merit in a project is achieved by going above and beyond, such as giving a talk or demonstration on the topic or helping others learn the project by providing education or help. Upon completion of your record book, turn it into your club leader. He or she will complete the Record Book Check Sheet or you can complete it together.

Record Book Due Date & Judging Schedule: Record books are due to your club general leader at a date he or she specifies. General leaders must have record books (with completed 4-H Member & Leaders Record Book Check Sheet and "Marinette County 4-H Award Nominations" sheet [given to leaders in club fair packet]) to the 4-H Office by 5:00 p.m. on Tues., October 5th. If you are judging, books may be brought in with you on Thurs., October 7th. Judging begins at 5:00 (or whatever time you can attend) in the Resource Center Conference Room. One leader or parent from each club is asked to help with judging. Subs will be provided by the 4-H Leaders Assoc., but you must call the 4-H office by Tuesday noon to let them know if you are coming and what you would like ordered.

2021-22 PROJECT YEAR BEGINS OCT. 1

Our new enrollment year for 2022 begins on October 1.

Members and leaders must re-enroll each year by November 30. Regular members must be in 3rd gr or older.

Cloverbuds (children in 5K through 2nd grade) should be listed in your club enrollment. Cloverbuds can participate in club activities. They can exhibit at the County Fair, only in the Cloverbud category, and do not receive premiums.

Re-enrollment deadline is November 30, 2021. *New members can join at any time, but must enroll by May 1 to enter in the Fair.

*May 1 is also the deadline to add or drop projects. *You must be enrolled in a project in order to exhibit at the Fair in that project.

We hope that your 4-H club will have a special promotion to tell the benefits of 4-H in your respective communities this fall. Invite your friends to join!!

4-H TRIPS

Teens interested in attending trips should fill out the Marinette County Sponsored Event Application. First round was due Oct. 1. All information regarding age requirements and trips were included in the leaders packet at the Fair. Following that, applications are due Feb. 1 and applicants will be interviewed at the February 4-H Association Meeting.

Remember to say thank you to your award sponsors and to acknowledge all awards received, whether received at



the County Fair, Achievement Day, or throughout the year. Sponsors give because they believe in 4-H and in you the youth!!! Let's show them we appreciate their efforts and give them a word of thanks.

4-H INSURANCE

All enrolled 4-H members and Cloverbuds, grades 5K & up, are covered for certain 4-H events. If you have an injury during a 4-H event, call the 4-H office immediately for a report form. You must report your injury within 20 days.

Vice President Anne Biernasz called the meeting to order at 6:32pm.

Secretary's Report: Jennie P. made a motion to accept the secretary's report as was printed in the May Newsletter. Barb K. seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Kari handed out a spreadsheet of transactions since the end of April. There are a few bills still needed to be paid as well as some outstanding checks that need to be cashed. From the profit from the food stand, clubs who worked a shift will also need to be \$100. The workers from the food stand will also need to be paid. Workers worked a total of 248.25 hours during the fair. Jennie P. made a motion to pay the bills. Bark K. seconded. Motion carried.
