To be eligible, you must have been in Marinette County 4-H at least four years and be a 4-H graduate of Marinette County or eligible to graduate. Open to high school seniors, freshmen and sophomores in post-secondary education, inc. college, university or technical school and a full-time student. Scholarship applications are available in the Extension office. Deadline: *March 1*.

WI 4-H FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS


The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will award more than \$15,000 in scholarships to outstanding Wisconsin 4-H members and alumni pursuing higher education in 2022. To be considered for financial support, applications must be received by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation via email by Tuesday, March 15, 2022, 5:00 pm.

WI 4-H Foundation scholarships are awarded to students based on demonstrated personal growth through 4-H, development and leadership in 4-H, academic performance & future educational goals.

To be eligible for scholarships students must have been a WI 4-H member for at least three years; should have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college or technical school during the 2022-2023 academic school year. Scholarship winners from previous years are not eligible.

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NATIONAL 4-H CONFERENCE APPLICATION DEADLINE EXTENDED

The deadline to apply has been extended to January 17th, 2022. So...if you are a leader in your school or community and are interested in issues that are facing young people in your community and across the country, want to engage and learn more about how the federal government works, and would like to travel to DC to meet other leaders from Wisconsin and around the country...APPLY today!!

National 4-H Conference is a working conference in which youth leaders from around the country—at the invitation of the Secretary of Agriculture—assist in the development of recommendations to help guide 4-H Youth Development Programs and other federal department activities nationally and in their communities. This experience brings together youth, volunteer leaders, and state and county Extension staff members from across the United States, the U.S. Territories, and the Canadian Provinces. The Conference includes roundtable discussions and federal partner agency presentations and an opportunity for delegates to engage with their U.S. Senators and Representatives. For years, this conference has been a rich and meaningful experience for all the youth and adults who have participated.

National 4-H Conference delegates will:

- •Participate in a round table topic of their choosing that will focus on key topics facing youth today, such as: leadership, agriculture, crime, natural resources, social media, and more.
- •Participate in professional workshops.
- •Meet with legislators from their state to discuss important issues.
- •Have a chance to network with youth and adults from across the country.
- •Learn more about youth programming and think about ways to improve programming across the nation.
- •Develop an action plan that will be put to use in their own communities.
- •Have fun!

What is this Experience:

Experience history & heritage by immersing in a 10-day bus journey to the East Coast — Youth-led content throughout the experience — Increase knowledge of American history while experiencing where it occurred — Dynamic exposure to diverse cultural experiences and perspectives of the foundation of our nation.

Participant Eligibility:

- · All youth grades 8-10 (Youth in 11th -12th grade eligible for 2022 dates ONLY)
- · Pre-Registration in 4-H Online 2.0 open January 3-14, 2022. Youth and their parent/guardian must complete the online registration together; it includes several questions for the youth participant to answer!
- · Each experience is limited to 44 youth, decisions about who is selected to travel are based on the following factors: first-come-first-serve registrants, # of youth per experience, full rooms by identified gender, ages of youth traveling together, eligibility to participate in future years
- · Estimated Cost of Experience = \$1,650

All participants will be required to agree to and abide by COVID Safety Protocols.

ASSOCIATION BOARD ELECTIONS - SEEKING TO FILL ALL OFFICER POSITIONS

Board elections will now be held during Achievement Day/Leader Recognition on Sun., February 6. Association meetings are held at 6:30 p.m. on the 3rd Monday of every month (rotating locations) with the exception of Aug. & Dec. (no meeting). In addition to descriptions below, board member responsibilities include planning the annual 4-H calendar & annual budget & working with Extension Program Educator to determine 4-H policies and goals, determine training needs, make decisions about the county 4-H program and carry out other business of the Association. This is a great way to get involved!

President: (two year term) Presides at all meetings of the Leaders Association and acts as Chair of Board meetings. President and Extension Program Educator work together to solve problems and plan educational opportunities.

Secretary: (two year term) Keeps minutes of all meetings of the Leaders Association and turns them into the 4-H Office for the 4-H newsletter. Brings copy of minutes to each meeting. Works with the Extension Office in getting out correspondence and communications when necessary.

Youth Reps (2): (1 or 2 year term) Works as active member together with other board members and 4-H Program Educator in a youth-adult partnership model including attending regular meetings, collaborating on 4-H Leader Association projects, providing input & making decisions, & setting goals for the county 4-H program. Representatives should be at least 12 years old.

Board elections for Vice President and Treasurer were to be held during Achievement Day/Leader Recognition on Sun., July 11. Due to low turnout, elections had been postponed.

Vice President: Presides in the absence of the President and takes care of all the President's duties during the absence.

Treasurer: Collects and cares for all money of the Leaders Association, including camp account. Shall pay bills of the Leaders Association as approved by the board of directors. Assists with budget planning.

Livestock Skill-a-thon: Everything you know about raising your animal adds up to so much knowledge of the species and the industry. The Skill-a-thon contest will help you challenge you to share that information through a written quiz and learning.

Meats Judging Contest: This contest tests the knowledge of youth in the placement of carcass and retail cut classes, carcass grading, retail cut identification, and a quiz.
