Fees are as follows:

Registration Fee Options: (includes meals, breaks, facility fees and supplies)

• \$100 registration fee per person - Friday – Sunday (3 meals Saturday, 1 meal Sunday)

\$75 registration fee Saturday – (lunch and dinner)

Lodging is available Friday and Saturday night.

Single Occupancy - \$100/night (adults only)

• Double Occupancy - \$50/night (adults and family members only)

• Quad Occupancy - \$35/night (adults, youth, or family members)

If you're going into grades 6, 7 or 8 and love the "ARTS", why not join us for this year's WI 4-H Arts Camp, *October 22-23, 2022*, at Upham Woods, WI Dells?! You'll have the opportunity to explore different types of art (theater art, visual art, musical art, dance, and photography), while making new friends, developing new skills and enjoying new experiences.

WI 4-H Arts Camp is designed for middle school youth to come together and explore the "ARTS." Participants will participate in five different sessions that focus on different forms of art. Space is limited!

Arts Camp is being planned and will be led by a talented group of 4-H youth and adult volunteers and staff. Additional adult support is needed! If you know of an adult who would enjoy helping create a safe and supportive environment for our campers, please tell them about the program and encourage them to complete an Adult Advisor Application in 4-H Online. Adult Advisors participate fully in the camp program and provide support for the youth participants. Adult Advisors may not be assigned to the same cabins or groups as their children, but will be at camp to provide support & leadership for all campers.

Funding for the WI 4-H Arts Camp Program comes in part through a grant from the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation. Camp is \$100 for campers and \$55 for Adult Advisors. ## **RECORD BOOK PROCESS & DATES**

The purpose of a record book is to: 1) set goals for yourself; 2) share and record what you've learned; 3) reflect on accomplishments or give thought to how you may or may not do something differently next time. It is also the current way to apply for several county-wide awards. Record books are not associated with fair checks in any way. Please see the "My Record Book Guide" and "Record Book Check Sheet" that was included in your leader's County Fair packet. Be careful to include all activities you participated in. Merit in a project is achieved by going above and beyond, such as giving a talk or demonstration on the topic or helping others learn the project by providing education or help. Upon completion of your record book, turn it into your club leader. He or she will complete the Record Book Check Sheet or you can complete it together.

Record Book Due Date & Judging Schedule: Record books are due to your club general leader at a date he or she specifies. General leaders must have record books (with completed 4-H Member & Leaders Record Book Check Sheet and "Marinette County 4-H Award Nominations" sheet [given to leaders in club fair packet]) to the 4-H Office by 4:30 p.m. on Tues., October 4th. If you are judging, books may be brought in with you on Thurs., October 6th. Judging begins at 5:00 (or whatever time you can attend) in the Resource Center Conference Room. One leader or parent from each club is asked to help with judging. Food will be provided by the 4-H Leaders Assoc., but you must call the 4-H office by Tuesday noon to let them know if you are coming.

## SAVE THE DATE—2023 NATIONAL 4-H CONFERENCE

Mark your calendar for the 2023 National 4-H Conference, to be held April 14-19 in person at the Hyatt Regency Crystal City in Arlington, Virginia, and online. Deemed "the Secretary's Conference," this Conference is the flagship youth development opportunity of USDA. Today, the Conference remains true to its original intent to develop the next generation of leaders while continuing to be future-focused. The Conference brings together youth, volunteer leaders, county and state Extension staff, Land-grant University faculty and administrators, as well as state and federal government officials from across the United States and its Territories. ## LOOKING FOR YOUTH & YOUNG ADULTS AGES 14 -25 w/A PASSION TO END YOUTH HOMELESSNESS

The Oconto and Marinette County 4-H Programs are partnering with NEWCAP to address youth homeless in our area by participating on a youth action board. Please see the graphic below along with the attached flyer for more information. This is a great opportunity to make a difference in our community!

## TOP FIVE QUESTIONS ABOUT THE YOUTH ACTION BOARD .....

1) What is a Youth Action Board, and who should join?

The short version: YAB members are anyone 24 and under (at least 2/3 of have experienced homelessness and/or housing instability) who want to come together to give a voice to and advocate for youth who are experiencing, who have experienced, or who might someday experience homelessness in their community.

## 2) What should I expect?

Thoughtful conversation, friendly debate, and the chance to impact how funding is spent and policies are written in your arearegarding youth homelessness.

The YAB is very much a place for youth—the facilitator is there simply to help with the conversation. If youth are struggling with ideas or topics, they might pose a question or ask youth's opinions. They bring what the grant/agencies want to hear from the youth, let the youth talk, and take

## 3) What would be expected of me?

★ Come when you can. I get it—you all have busy lives. You're not expected to attend every meeting, every time. ★ Follow the group agreements such as being respectful, having patience with yourself and others, and keeping an open mind. ★ Share what you are comfortable sharing about your experiences, and keep other's stories confidential.

## 4) When and where?

We were meeting virtually due to the large area this group covers, but we are looking to start hybrid meetings the facilitator will travel to where the youth are at, and other youth

## 5) What's in it for me?

Besides a chance to make real changes in your community... money! YAB members aged 14 and older are paid \$15 an hour for their time (via Venmo); unfortunately, we are not allowed to compensate younger youth, but they

## 2022-23 PROJECT YEAR BEGINS OCT. 1

Our new enrollment year for 2023 begins on October 1.

Members and leaders must re-enroll each year by November 30. Regular members must be in 3rd gr or older.

Cloverbuds (children in 5K through 2nd grade) should be listed in your club enrollment. Cloverbuds can participate in club activities. They can exhibit at the County Fair, only in the Cloverbud category, and do not receive premiums.

Re-enrollment deadline is November 30, 2022. \*New members can join at any time, but must enroll by May 1 to enter in the Fair.

\*May 1 is also the deadline to add or drop projects. \*You must be enrolled in a project in order to exhibit at the Fair in that project.

We hope that your 4-H club will have a special promotion to tell the benefits of 4-H in your respective communities this fall. Invite your friends to join!!

## **4-H TRIPS**

Teens interested in attending trips should fill out the Marinette County Sponsored Event Application. First round is due Oct. 1. All information regarding age requirements and trips were included in the leaders packet at the Fair. Following that, applications are due Feb. 1 and applicants will be interviewed at the February 4-H Association Meeting.

The deadline for submitting the financial review (covering the fiscal year July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022) to the Extension office was September 1st, if your club has not submitted the financial review, this must be done as soon as possible. The deadline for submitting the annual club charter to the Extension office is November 1st. These dates are set by the UW-Madison, Division of Extension state office to comply with IRS deadlines. A club that does not complete paperwork in a timely fashion risks no longer being recognized as a 4 -H club or group which could lead to dissolution of the club.
