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#### ASSOCIATION BOARD ELECTIONS - SEEKING TO FILL OFFICER POSITIONS


Board elections will be held during Achievement Day/ Leader Recognition on January 14. Association meetings are held at 6:30 p.m. on the 3rd Monday of every month (rotating locations) with the exception of Aug. & Dec. (no meeting). In addition to descriptions below, board member responsibilities include planning the annual 4-H calendar & annual budget & working with Extension Program Educator to determine 4-H policies and goals, determine training needs, make decisions about the county 4-H program and carry out other business of the Association. This is a great way to get involved!

President: (two year term) Presides at all meetings of the Leaders Association and acts as Chair of Board meetings. President and Extension Program Educator work together to solve problems and plan educational opportunities.

Secretary: (two year term) Keeps minutes of all meetings of the Leaders Association & turns them into the 4-H office for the 4-H newsletter. Brings copy of minutes to each meeting. Works with the Extension Office in getting out correspondence & communications when necessary.

Youth Reps (2): (1 or 2 year term) Works as active member together with other board members and 4-H Program Educator in a youth-adult partnership model including attending regular meetings, collaborating on 4-H Leader Association projects, providing input & making decisions, & setting goals for the county 4-H program. Representatives should be at least 12 years old.

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#### **SPACE CAMP**

April 18-22, 2024. 4-H Space Camp is an educational experience where youth from across the state take a bus down to Huntsville, Alabama, for a 4 day journey. Youth get the opportunity to venture away from home to meet new friends, develop leadership and teamwork skills, and learn all about space.

Any youth in grades 6-8 may register to go to Space Camp. Register through 4HOnline for Space Camp. Registration will be open from November 15-December 15 prior to program year.

Delegates will be notified by the State 4-H Office by January 12 of the program year whether they are attending or wait-listed. After registration closes, delegates will be sent a link to register for Space Camp through the Space Camp website. All delegates must register online for Space Camp prior to March 1st.

#### **IMPORTANT CHARTER PAPERWORK UPDATE**

Each 4-H club or group is required to complete financial review and Charter renewal process annually. The deadline for submitting the annual club charter to the Extension office is November 1st. These dates are set by the UW-Madison, Division of Extension state

office to comply with IRS deadlines. A club that does not complete paperwork in a timely fashion risks no longer being recognized as a 4-H club or group which could lead to dissolution of the club. If you need assistance in completing these documents contact Aimee at: <u>aimee.elkins@wisc.edu</u>.

#### 2023-24 PROJECT YEAR BEGAN OCT. 1

Our new enrollment year for 2024 began on October 1.

Members and leaders must re-enroll each year by November 30. Regular members must be in 3rd gr or older.

Cloverbuds (children in 5K through 2nd grade) should be listed in your club enrollment. Cloverbuds can participate in club activities. They can exhibit at the County Fair, only in the Cloverbud category, and do not receive premiums.

Re-enrollment deadline is November 30, 2023. \*New members can join at any time, but must enroll by May 1 to enter in the Fair.

\*May 1 is also the deadline to add or drop projects. \*You must be enrolled in a project in order to exhibit at the Fair in that project.

We hope that your 4-H club will have a special promotion to tell the benefits of 4-H in your respective communities this fall. Invite your friends to join!!

#### **4-H TRIPS**

Teens interested in attending trips should fill out the Marinette County Sponsored Event Application. First round was due Oct. 1. All information regarding age requirements and trips were included in the leaders packet at the Fair. Following that, applications are due Feb. 1 and applicants will be interviewed at the February 4-H Association Meeting.

#### **THRIVE SURVEY COMING SOON**

This fall, Wisconsin 4-H will be encouraging members (ages 13-18) to complete a survey about their 4-H experience. The survey will help Wisconsin 4-H to learn about the quality of our programs.

#### WI 4-H FOUNDATION CELEBRATES THE ARTS

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation provides support for arts and communications programs that encourage youth to develop strong leadership, creative and communications skills. Each year the Foundation highlights 4-H artists through the Celebrate the Arts art contest. This year's contest runs November 1, 2023 through January 15, 2024. All submissions will be online. A link will be made available soon.

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation Celebrates the Arts is a contest, to be held annually for the purpose of: • Promoting 4-H Arts Programming • Raising Funds to Support 4-H Art Programs • Telling the 4-H Story • Raising Awareness of the WI 4-H Foundation and the 4-H Program. Proceeds from any Celebrate the Arts events or sales will be split evenly with half invested in the Talen Endowment for 4-H Arts Programming and half used for arts programming in the next 4-H program year.

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will sponsor the art contest, open to any current Wisconsin 4-H member, with cash prizes totaling nearly \$1,000. The contest will be held virtually, with photos of all entries submitted electronically. The contest will be broken into nine categories (Drawing; Painting; Pottery/Ceramics/Clay; Photography; Paper; Fabric/Yarn/Fiber; Any Other Media; 4-H Art (non-photography); 4-H Art (photography). Artists are STRONGLY encouraged to create art that has a 4-H theme or has root in their 4-H experience (example: a photo taken on a 4-H trip or of another 4-H member working on a 4-H project; a painting inspired by a 4-H event; pottery that incorporates the clover). #### October Leaders Association Minutes October, 16, 2023

President Jennie P. called the meeting to order at 6:03 pm.

Pledges were said.

Secretary's Report: Lisa made a motion to accept the minutes as printed in the newsletter. Anne seconded. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Updated balances for accounts were provided, including outstanding checks that have not been cashed. There was a discussion on whether or not clubs get paid if the club signs up for a full shift or if individual youth from a club work with other clubs. This has been voted on in the past and previous newsletter will be checked. Until the policy is located, only clubs who signed up for a shift (or 2) will be paid. Barb made a motion for Julia to pay the bills and clubs for food stand shifts. Lisa seconded. Motion carried.

Update from Alexis: There are still 2 clubs who have not submitted there AFRs, which were due last month. Club charters are due Nov. 1. The next Teen Leaders Group will meet on October 22 at 2 pm in Grover. Being a different day, Alexis is hopeful that more teens will come. There are 3 adults and 1 youth signed up for Fall Forum. Planning is underway for a winter camp in February. American Spirit trip flyers are available along with the Take and Make projects. Let the office know if club members would like one of the project kits. Emails about the kits were sent to leaders.

#### **Committee Reports:**

Food Stand: Anne purchased a microwave and will donate to the food stand.

Fair Board: The premium book will be updated for 2024 fair. Saturday was the meeting to discuss changes.

Raffle: None

Awards/Trips: No one has applied, so there have been no interviews.

Royalty: Dorothy asked about purchasing items to hand out at events, especially parades. Asked about potentially looking at the royalty budget to purchase these items. Will also communicate with Nancy to see if the office is able to help out getting items. Dorothy also asked about the need for multiple sashes because they are getting dirty quickly at the fair.

Shooting Sports: Registration for shooting sports certification is open. Contact the office for details.

#### **Old Business:**

Record Book Judging went well. Seven leaders helped out.

Movie: Anne touched based with the Mariner for a possibility of a movie in January. The movie is not known at this time, but will be youth appropriate.

#### **New Business:**

Achievement Day: Will be held on January 14th at Crivitz High School. Steve is in process of securing the space. Noon will be lunch followed by awards at 1pm.

Elections: The positions of president and secretary are up this year. Deb will not be returning as secretary, so there is a need to think about someone for the position.

Reminder was also given about reenrollment for leaders and youth.

### **Preparing for the New 4-H Year**



The 4-H year officially begins in October each year. Even though the program year begins in October, 4-H enrollment begins in September. Counties in Wisconsin usually have an enrollment "deadline." This deadline can be the cutoff for determining who can represent 4-H at certain events.

No matter the date of your local deadline, re-enrolling in 4-H through the 4-H Online portal as soon as possible ensures that you receive all 4-H communications and other important program news.

### Adding, Dropping, or Keeping Projects

Enrollment is the perfect time to add or remove projects in your 4-H Online profiles. 4-H members usually continue with the same projects from the year before, and it's pretty normal to add one or two new ones as well! First year members arerecommended to only select one or two projects for their first year. The second year of membership is a great time to pick between three to five total projects.

Work with your youth to see what projects they liked, didn't like, or want to learn more about. There is nothing wrong if your member decides to keep the same projects from the year before!



**Reminder: 4-H members** in grades K-2 can only be signed up for the **Cloverbud project!** 

#### Member Goals

On the opposite page, 4-H members are being challenged to write their personal 4-H goals for the new year. Setting goals can help with project selection, and it should help members plan out a path to success in the new 4-H year. See what goals your youth has chosen for the new 4-H year and identify ways to help them achieve those goals.

#### **Family Member Goals**

Have those in your family set goals as well! Goals might include attending more club meetings, helping at 4-H activities, or participating in certain county events. Try to find ways to keep 4-H as a togtherness activity!

#### **Club** Goals

Each year, 4-H clubs complete a Charter Renewal form. This form is usually completed by adult leaders and youth officers, but the charter might be talked about at a club meeting. Clubs are tasked with identifying club goals each year. Have your family brainstorm some S.M.A.R.T. goals for the club to strive for in the new year, such as planning an outreach event with a local community group or adding more welcoming activities for new families.

### **Setting Goals**

Every year, many people create New Year's Resolutions. These resolutions are **goals** for the new year. Fall is the beginning of the new 4-H year, which makes it the perfect time to set goals for about what you want to do!

#### S.M.A.R.T. Goals

Goals are more likely to be successful when you give yourself something specific to aim for. Any of your resolutions for the new 4-H year should be S.M.A.R.T.

Specific: Goals should be well defined and clear.

Measurable: This will help you know when you've been successful.

Achievable: Be realistic! Think of things that will challenge you but are still doable.

**Relevant**: Your goals should be important to you. Set goals that you want to complete!

Timely: Give yourself a specific time frame to complete your goals.

#### What are your goals?
