MAROCOSHA SUMMER CAMP 2024 REGISTRA-TION OPENS ON MARCH 1ST!

We are excited to be offering a three-day, two-night 4-H

Camp for Marinette, Oconto and Shawano Counties to be held at Camp Bird near Crivitz, WI from June 14th-16th this year!

We have a great staff of teens and adults that have already spent many hours in training and preparation for your child to arrive. This is a great chance to spend time outdoors, make new friends, and even learn a bit! Activities already in the schedule are swimming, Raccoon Circles (team building), campfires, hikes, lots of games, and canoeing or kayaking! Our camp food is awesome, just ask former campers. This will be a week of actively enjoying nature, the outdoors, and the fellowship of new friends while learning. We also have a health supervisor and lifeguard on staff.

Campers can choose to be transported by bus from one of several stops. The location of these stops will be determined where campers are registering from. We will contact you closer to camp to confirm which location your youth would like to board. If a bus option is not chosen, a scheduled drop off time at Camp Bird can be arranged.

Registration opens for 4-H Members on March 1, 2024. If there are spots available, youth not enrolled in 4-H may register beginning March 4, 2024. **4-H members cost:** \$125 camp payment. Due to the generosity of the Marinette County 4-H Leaders Association, and funds primarily obtained through the annual 4-H fair food stand and raffle, Marinette County 4-H members are only responsible for \$50.00 (per camper registered to attend). Money must be sent to the Marinette County Extension Office prior to May 10th or your spot may be given to a wait list camper.

Non 4-H members will be responsible to submit \$150 camp payment (per camper registered to attend). Money must be sent to the Marinette County Extension Office prior to May 10th or you spot may be given to a wait list camper.

CANCELLATION POLICY (New in 2024) - If you need to cancel your registration, you may do so, without penalty prior to June 1, 2024. If cancelling your regis-

tration on, or after June 1, 2024 a \$50 per camper late cancellation fee will be assessed. Please contact the Shawano County Extension Office (715-526-6136) if you need to cancel for any reason.

CO. 4-H LEADERS ASSOC. SCHOLARSHIPS

To be eligible, you must have been in Marinette County 4-H at least four years and be a 4-H graduate of Marinette County or eligible to graduate. Open to high school seniors, freshmen and sophomores in post-secondary education, inc. college, university or technical school and a full-time student. Scholarship applications are available in the Extension office. Deadline: *March 1*.

WI 4-H FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will award more than \$20,000 in scholarships to outstanding Wisconsin 4-H members and alumni pursuing higher education in 2024. To be considered for financial support, applications must be received by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation via email by Friday, March 1, 2024, 5:00 pm.

Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships are awarded to students based on demonstrated personal growth through 4-H, development and leadership in 4-H, academic performance and future educational goals.

To be eligible for Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships students must have been a Wisconsin 4-H member for at least three years; should have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and be enrolled or planning to enroll at a university, college or technical school during the 2024-2025 academic school year. Scholarship winners from previous years are not eligible to receive a second 4-H Foundation scholarship.

CLOTHING REVUE

The Clothing Revue will be held on Saturday, April 13 at 1:00 pm at the Shop on Main, 821 Main St., Oconto. Please utilize curbside parking only!

What is a clothing revue?

The clothing revue is a fun event for all boys and girls in 4-H, grades kindergarten through one year post high school, to model what they have made or purchased. This event includes knitting, crocheting, sewing, consumer savvy*, or alterations*. You do not need to be enrolled in these projects. Ribbons will be awarded.

What you can do:

- Make something to wear this can be an entire outfit or just one thing. (Ex: a hat or a hat, mittens, and scarf to match, a shirt, pajamas, etc.) Or you can purchase an entire outfit.
- You will wear your creation before the judge and tell him/her all about it. The judge may not touch your garment at all, they will only judge on how it looks on you.
- You will then model your outfit while the Master of Ceremony reads the card that you sent in with your registration.

*What is consumer savvy? Rather than making the garment, you go out and purchase it along with accessories to make a complete outfit. (Shirt, pants, shoes, socks, belt, etc.)

*What does alterations mean? This is a changed outfit that you wear; it can be something that is too big for you and you altered it to fit you, maybe a dress of your mom's. Or it can be a huge t-shirt that you made into a dress.

*You will be judged on: Overall look, construction of garment, knowledge, and presentation.


